

MOSQUITO & TICK REPELLENTS



The use of EPA-registered repellents containing DEET are recommended by the CDC to prevent mosquito and tick bites which can lead to illness.

WEST NILE VIRUS



- 47 states report human infections.
- 65% of cases classified as neuroinvasive disease (meningitis or encephalitis).
- Highest number of cases (1999-2018) in: AZ, CA, CO, ID, IA, IL, KS, LA, MI, MS, MT, ND, NE, NM, OK, SD, TX, and WY.

OTHER VIRUSES



- Mosquitos found in the US can also transmit less common viruses.
- Zika virus
 - Denque virus
 - Eastern equine encephalitis virus
 - La Crosse virus
 - St. Louis encephalitis

LYME DISEASE



- 46 states reported confirmed lyme disease cases in 2018.
- It is estimated approximately 300,000 people are diagnosed with lyme disease each year.
- Highest number of cases in: CT, DE, MA, MD, ME, MN, NH, NJ, NY, PA, RI, VT, VA, Wash. DC, WI and WV.
